HOCKEY BENGAL

ockey Bengal (earlier known as Bengal Hockey Association) is the oldest Hockey Organization in India. It was established on 27th April, 1908 in Calcutta. Whereas, other Associations were formed much later, Sind Hockey Association (Karachi) was formed in 1920, Bihar, Gwalior & Bombay in 1923. Delhi Hockey Association came into existence in 1924, Punjab in 1925, UP in 1926, Bhopal in 1934, Patiala & Mysore in 1937.

Mr. Ashwini Kumar, former President of IHF mentioned that in India, Hockey was first played in Calcutta in 1885 as per **Pat Rowley's "Book of Hockey"**. The first National Hockey Championship was held in Calcutta in 1928. At that time, it was called the "Inter Provincials National Hockey Championship" where all the five provinces of undivided India participated. The first Indian Hockey team for the Amsterdam Olympic 1928 was also selected in Calcutta.

In 1952 the National Hockey Championship was held in Calcutta for the 6th time, where in the final Bengal defeated Punjab and broke their chance of Hat Trick of National titles. It took two matches to decide the 1952 Championship.

Over the years Bengal has produced 25 Hockey Olympians, to name a few Pat Jensen, Leslie Walter Claudius, Keshav Chander Datt, Jaswant Singh Rajput, Gurbux Singh, Joginder Singh, Inam-Ur Rahman, Ashok Kumar, Dr. Vece Paes (he passed away on 14th instant) and Bir Bahadur Chettri, who have together won 27 Gold medals, 01 Silver medal & 05 Bronze medals in the Olympics games between 1928 to 1980. No other Sports Association in West Bengal has achieved this so far.

Calcutta Hockey League was first held in 1905, three years before the formation of Bengal Hockey Association in 1908. Bengal used to dominate Indian Hockey in the 1940's, 1950's & 1960's. In those days there were some strong teams participating in the Calcutta Hockey League such as Calcutta Customs, Port Commissioners, Bengal Nagpur Railway besides the three big clubs viz. Mohun Bagan, East Bengal & Mohammedan Sporting Clubs.

Hockey Bengal organises Calcutta Hockey League and also the State Hockey Championship (for both Boys & Girls) where 60 Hockey clubs and 18 districts participate. As already mentioned, the Calcutta Hockey League - 1st Division





commenced in 1905, the 2^{nd} Division was started in 1907 and the 3^{nd} Division in 1920. These Championships are held every year since their inception except in 1947 due to partition and then in 2021 due to Covid pandemic.

Hockey Bengal is also the proud organizer of the world's oldest Hockey tournament, the "Beighton Cup" which is also known as the "Blue Riband" of Indian Hockey where all the top Hockey teams of India fight for the coveted Cup. It is a desire of all hockey players to play in the prestigious Beighton Cup.

After a lot of struggle, dedication and hard work of the Hockey Bengal Officials finally the Hockey fraternity of Bengal have got a beautiful Tent in Kolkata Maidan area on Red Road.

It is worth mentioning that over the years Officials of Hockey Bengal had left no stone unturned and tried their level best to get an Astro Turf hockey ground in Kolkata so that Bengal players get the much-needed training throughout the year.

Their efforts paid dividend and with the initiative of West Bengal Government and in particular the support of Mr. Aroop Biswas, Hon'ble Sports Minister of West Bengal the Vivekananda Yuba Bharati International Hockey Stadium at Salt Lake is ready and will be inaugurated during the 126th All India Beighton Cup 2025.

With the support of Mr. Firhad Hakim, Chairman, WBHIDCO, Bengal has got a Second Hockey Astro Turf ground at Dumurjala Khelnagari, Howrah which is already being utilised for training of Grassroot players and Bengal teams for participation in the National Championships. This year the Premier League was also held on the Dumurjala Turf.

The Hockey fraternity of Bengal is very much grateful to Government of West Bengal for this long awaited artificial turf Hockey fields.





HOCKEY BENGAL: ROOTS IN THE PAST SOARING FOR THE FUTURE

ockey Bengal is the oldest hockey association in the country: Bengal Hockey Association (BHA), as it was known then, was founded back in 1908. We take great pride in the storied legacy of the Association in the history of Indian hockey. We are also aware of the crucial role played by Kolkata (Calcutta at the time), in general, and the Beighton Cup, in particular, in the evolution of hockey across the Indian subcontinent. Hockey Bengal remains fully committed to building on that legacy to revive people's love for the sport in the state and this is an excellent opportunity to survey some of the recent initiatives by Hockey Bengal to that end.

The jewel in Hockey Bengal's crown will be the new International Hockey Stadium in Salt Lake that is scheduled to be inaugurated during this year's Beighton Cup. The stadium had been a longstanding demand of hockey enthusiasts in Bengal and is the result of years of unstinting efforts by a host of people, too many to name here. Hockey Bengal would like to express its gratitude to the Government of West Bengal, especially the Minister for Youth Services and Sports, Mr. Aroop Biswas, for making it possible to dream that in the near future we will witness India play an international hockey match on turf in the City of Joy. Of almost equal importance has been the setting up of the Dumurjala Turf Ground in the Dumurjala Khelnagari, Howrah, a brain child of our beloved Hon'ble Chief Minister, Ms. Mamata Banerjee. For this, Hockey Bengal would like to thank the Government of West Bengal as well as West Bengal Housing Infrastructure Development Corporation Limited (WBHIDCO), especially its erstwhile chairperson, Mr. Firhad Hakim. Some matches of the Calcutta Hockey League can now be played on turf, the surface on which international hockey is played, instead of grass. The standard of play in the League is also raised by the continued participation of the Kolkata Big Three: Mohun Bagan, East Bengal and Mohammedan Sporting clubs.

A strong Calcutta Hockey League can help build strong Bengal hockey teams in the national championships. The Bengal Men's Hockey Team competed in the 36th National Games (held in Rajkot) in 2022 and the 37th National Games (Goa) in 2023; the Bengal Women's Team took part in the 37th National Games (Goa) and the 38th National Games (Uttarakhand) in 2025. Age-group teams from Bengal regularly take part in Hockey India National Championships.





Hockey Bengal continues to support domestic hockey by organizing important age-group and women's competitions, including the 1st Hockey India Interdepartment Senior Women National Championship held in October 2021 and the 2nd Hockey India Junior Men and Women East Zone Championships in 2024.

The biggest challenge, we feel, is finding ways to promote grassroots hockey in Bengal because that is where the love for the sport must take root. An exclusive hockey grass ground is being made ready in Murshidabad, thanks to the support of the West Bengal Government and Mr. Rajarshi Mitra, the District Magistrate of Murshidabad. The surface of Hockey Bengal's own ground on the Kolkata Maidan has been developed into a grass ground with regular rejuvenation and a Tent has come up alongside it to provide basic facilities to the players. Hockey Bengal has started a Day Academy providing training free of cost to Under-16 girls and Under-14 boys at Dumurjala where training takes place four days a week—on Tuesdays, Thursdays, Saturdays and Sundays—under the watchful eyes of coaches handpicked by Hockey Bengal.

Hockey Bengal regained the permanent membership of Hockey India. It has received Income Tax exemption under 80G and set up a website to bring in transparency. Such good governance initiatives have not gone unnoticed: Hockey Bengal won the "Best State Member Unit Award for 2021-22" from Hockey India for hockey development work in the state and this year in March, in appreciation of upholding the Beighton Cup legacy, Hockey Bengal won the "Hockey India President Award for Outstanding Achievement 2024".

With the support and love of our well-wishers, Hockey Bengal aims to go from strength to strength in the years to come.

CALCUTTA HOCKEY LEAGUE

alcutta Hockey League is being organized by Hockey Bengal. The first edition was held in 1905. It is a division based league held in Kolkata and is the oldest field hockey league in India. Until the formation of the top division national leagues such as Premier Hockey League (PHL) and Hockey India League (HIL) post 2000s, the Calcutta Hockey League was the most competitive league in the country.

The league was first held in 1905, three years before the formation of the Bengal Hockey Association (BHA) in 1908. It is considered the next prominent competition to Beighton Cup in status and eminence. The First Division commenced in 1905, and later expanded to the Second Division in 1907, Third Division in 1920, Fourth Division in 1932 and First Division Group - B in 1933. The competition has been held annually ever since, except the year of partition in 1947 and later in 2020 due to Covid pandemic.

The early years were dominated by the teams such as Sibpur B.E. College followed by the Anglo-Indian Club - Calcutta Rangers and the Calcutta Customs throughout the 1910 and 1920 decades. The first team composed of Indian players to win the league was Greer Sporting club who achieved the feat in 1919. In the later years and post-Independence era the league was dominated by the "Big Three" of Kolkata, Mohun Bagan A.C, East Bengal Club and Mohammedan Sporting.

Presently, the Calcutta Hockey league consists of Calcutta Premier Hockey League (CPHL), 1st Division Group-"A", 1st Division Group-"B", 2nd Division and the 3rd Division. Premier League is very competitive and many Olympians and International players participate from various clubs to win the prestigious Calcutta Premier Hockey League.


